The Social Security Administration has announced that Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits will increase by 0.3% in 2017. The chart below identifies key figures that are affected by the annual Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) for the years 2015 through 2017.

¹ \$1 in benefits is withheld for every \$2 in earnings above limit.

² Applies only to earnings for months prior to attaining full retirement age. \$1 in benefits is withheld for every \$3 in earnings above the limit.

³ A person born in either 1949, 1950, or 1951 will reach full retirement age in 2015, 2016, or 2017 at age 66.

⁴ The Department of Health and Human Services has not yet announced Medicare premium changes for 2017. Standard monthly premiums are listed for 2015 and 2016. High income taxpayers may be subject to higher premiums.

⁵ Medicare tax rate increases by 0.9% on wages and SE income above the threshold amount, plus 3.8% on unearned income above the threshold amount.

⁶ A decrease in full maximum benefits occurs when there is no COLA, but there is an increase in the national average wage index.
